Appendix 3 - Access Environment and Conservation:

Strategic and Operational Leadership and Management - Future State

As part of the process of strengthening the Access Management Group, we believe that it is important to formalise it's role and methodology. This includes setting out clearly, how it links to the Board and National Council, how it works with partners, stakeholders and sub-groups, and how it is involved in campaigns. This is set out in appendix 1 in the suggested 'Ways of Working' and new Terms of Reference. The table below illustrates how decision making powers are distributed across different parts of the BMC.

In order to clarify the roles of individuals and groups involved in access and conservation work, we are proposing the following structure:

Access, Environment and Conservation Strategic and Operational Leadership and Management - Future State

Intent is that all issues are aimed to be resolved at the lowest feasible level.
